On Saturday, October 20, 2012, the story of the Progressive Wrestling Alliance will reach its conclusion with *PWA Everlasting Epic VIII*. After an initial run that lasted 210 weeks from 2002 through 2006, the PWA shut its doors for nearly four years before launching *PWA: The Rebirth*, returning to the limelight in a seasonal format. After three seasons of this program, the PWA will culminate with this final installment of the PWA's signature event, which will emanate from Citi Field in Queens, New York and represents the organization's most ambitious effort in its 10-year history. Main-evented by the Seven Deadly Sins match – a PWA original creation that will be contested at *Everlasting Epic* for the first time – this grand finale will see more than three dozen of the PWA's finest competitors lay it all on the line for one last moment of glory. In the pages ahead, you will learn a little bit about each of the matches that will be contested on this bittersweet night, along with statistics and results that further illuminate the *Everlasting Epic* experience. The most ambitious main event in *Everlasting Epic* history, the Seven Deadly Sins match invades the PWA's flagship event for the first and only time.

Less than three weeks after PWA debuted in the summer of 2002, an early form of the Seven Deadly Sins match also made its first appearance. Won by Speed Demon (now known as Dan Crowley), the match featured seven participants, and victory afforded the winner a spot in a match to crown the first PWA International Champion at the very first *Everlasting Epic*. Ten years and five more SDS matches later, Seven Deadly Sins has evolved into the PWA's signature creation and the most dangerous and grueling contest it has to offer.

In the Seven Deadly Sins match, eight men step into an unforgiving and ever-changing world of elimination that will ultimately claim all but one of them. The match is split into seven parts, each called "Sins." The First Sin is innocuous enough – all eight men start the match in the ring, and it continues until one man is pinned. That man is then eliminated, and we move onto the Second Sin, during which elimination can only be scored via submission. After that, the only way to eliminate an opponent is to throw him over the top rope with both feet touching the arena floor. But then, the stakes rise to very dangerous levels.

In the Fourth Sin, elimination occurs when an individual is plastered through a table. Then, it's by knocking an opponent out for a 10-count. And then, the steel cage is lowered. Once the remaining individuals are trapped inside the cage, the fighting continues until two emerge. You can climb out of the cage to secure your spot in the Seventh Sin (the cage door always remains locked per PWA rules), or you can pin or submit an opponent inside the cage, which automatically eliminates him.

Finally, when just two men remain, the prize is suspended 15 feet above the ring, and the two remaining combatants must climb a ladder and pull it down to earn this ultimate victory. At

Everlasting Epic VIII, the prize in question is the PWA World Heavyweight Championship, as has been the case in four of the six previous SDS matches. However, this time, the man who emerges with the title will also earn the honor of being the last individual to ever do so.

In the weeks leading up to *Everlasting Epic*, eight men won qualifying matches to earn entry into this enormous main event, each with his own unique drive to overcome the odds at Citi Field.

It starts with the man who, 10 years ago, was victorious in the main event of the first *Everlasting Epic* to become the inaugural PWA World Heavyweight Champion. That man is THE ICEMAN JASON CALYSTO, a competitor many believe to be the greatest in PWA history. Calysto, who holds a 5-2 record at this event and will on October 20th main-event *Everlasting Epic* for an unprecedented fifth time, entered the final season of *PWA: The Rebirth* as its champion, having defeated Vulture to retain the title at *Everlasting Epic VII*. For Calysto, a five-time former PWA Champion, a victory in Seven Deadly Sins would allow him to bring the PWA Championship full-circle, something he failed to do the last time PWA shut its doors in 2006, at the conclusion of *Everlasting Epic V*.

On that night, Calysto lost the title to JAGUAR, making him just one of seven *Everlasting Epic* victims of a man many believe to be the most resilient competitor in PWA history. Never possessing the raw talent of The Iceman, Jaguar's never-say-die attitude and blatant refusal to yield under any circumstance led him to match Calysto's five reigns as PWA Champion – and even add an extra reign as world champion, having won the short-lived ORA Championship at *Everlasting Epic IV*. Though Jaguar will be competing in just his second *Everlasting Epic* main event, he carries with him a perfect 7-0 record at the PWA's flagship event, furthering his status as one of the most formidable threats in this match.

Though considered the two greatest superstars in PWA history, Calysto and Jaguar do have the odds working against them. Both recently turned 45 years old and, though they continue to perform at an elite level, the Seven Deadly Sins match is a young man's game. On top of that, it's a match that Calysto has never won. Jaguar, on the other hand, has won the SDS match before – back in 2005 – but it was his only win in six attempts. But there is also the experience factor: Jaguar on October 20th will become the only man to compete in all seven installments of this match.

While the PWA's two biggest legends attempt to turn back the clock and end this company's existence with their ultimate triumph, two young upstarts whose early careers have drawn undeniable parallels to their own will attempt to do the same.

There is the reigning PWA World Heavyweight Champion CHASE STONE, who last month became the youngest world champion in PWA history, winning the title at the age of 24. An All-American wrestler from Penn State University, Stone's technical prowess and unending confidence matches that of The Iceman at a similar point in his career. This even led to Stone cleanly defeating Calysto on one of the final episodes of *The Rebirth*. However, what Stone lacks that Calysto has in droves is fan support. Despite his talent, Stone is immature, impulsive, and lacking in character. Though he was in no serious danger, Stone opted to take advantage of a referee's distraction to cheat to win the PWA Championship, rather than attempt to win it honorably.

The man Stone cheated out of the title is EVAN BLACK, an individual who spent several years as an attorney before deciding on a drastic change in life, quitting his job at a prestigious law firm to chase his dream of becoming a professional wrestler. That journey led him to the PWA at the start of the Rebirth Era, and his rise to prominence since then has been inspirational. Possessing that same desire to win at all costs and refusal to succumb to any adversity, Black is eerily reminiscent

rules of engagement



One individual is eliminated during each section of the match, called Sins.
The individual left standing after all Seven Deadly Sins are complete will be PWA World Heavyweight Champion.

I. Elimination can occur via pinfall only.

II. Elimination can occur via submission only.

III. Elimination can occur via throwing an opponent over the top rope, with both feet touching the arena floor.

IV. Elimination occurs when an individual puts an opponent through a table.

V. Elimination occurs only when an opponent is knocked down for a count of 10.

VI. Contested in a steel cage, if an individual escapes the cage, that person advances to the Seventh Sin, with the two remaining combatants continuing the match under normal steel cage rules. If an individual is first pinned or made to submit, that person is eliminated and the two remaining combatants advance to the Seventh Sin.

VII. Contested under ladder match rules, with the PWA title belt hanging above the ring. The first person to grab the title is declared the winner of the Seven Deadly Sins match and the PWA World Heavyweight Champion.

of a young Jaguar. And in the Seven Deadly Sins match, where anything can happen, the odds of these four bastions of wrestling's past, present, and future mixing it up are high.

But they are hardly the only threats to the championship in this SDS field. In fact, the four remaining competitors in this bout have all been inducted into the PWA Hall of Fame.

There's ANTHONY FAILLA, a longtime rival of Jaguar's and a man who was voted the MVP of the PWA's Rebirth Era. In the first run of PWA, Failla was known as a massive underachiever, a man with all the tools to succeed, and whose two world championship wins and long, unexplained absences were viewed as only a fraction of what he should have accomplished. However, Failla returned for *The Rebirth* a new man, and almost immediately defeated Jaguar to win the PWA Championship. Since then, Failla has main-evented *Everlasting Epic* and remained in the world title mix steadily for three years. And Failla, unlike everyone in this match except Jaguar, has won the SDS match before, placing him firmly in the role of favorite.

There's SHOWTIME DAMON SAVAGE, once a tremendous fan-favorite, but now a man who has embraced the hatred of the PWA fans after years of feeling unappreciated. A former PWA Champion and *Everlasting Epic* main-eventer in his own right, Showtime has the unique distinction of being the only performer to compete in boxing matches on PWA pay-per-view. The former Golden Gloves winner has used that background to springboard to success in this organization, and the southpaw's knockout left hook remains one of the most feared finishing moves in the PWA.

Another previous *Everlasting Epic* main eventer is the Modern-Day Samurai SCYTHER, whose one reign as PWA World Heavyweight Champion back in 2004 still stands as the longest single reign in

that title's history. During that run, Scythe successfully defended the championship at *Everlasting Epic III*, earning him a distinction shared only by Jason Calysto in walking into an *EE* event with the world title and walking out still in possession of it. This will be Scythe's fifth Seven Deadly Sins match, and his impressive 5-2 record at *Everlasting Epic* could cause the stars to align for a Scythe upset victory at *EE8*.

And then there is Da Playboi ROMEO, the only competitor in this match to debut in the PWA during its 2002-2006 run and not have main-evented a prior *Everlasting Epic*. But Romeo has come close, losing the ORA World Championship to fellow Hot Boy Jaguar at *Everlasting Epic IV* inside Hell in a Cell in one of the featured matches. As a member of The Hot Boy\$, Romeo was one half of what is thought of as the greatest tag team in PWA history, winning the PWA Tag Team Championship a record five times. But Romeo has also achieved the rare PWA Grand Slam – winning the PWA, International, Progressive, and Tag Team titles in his career. And with his 5-1 *Everlasting Epic* record, it would be a mistake to not consider Romeo a serious dark horse threat.

But the entire complexion of this match could change if the Alaskan Monster SOLOMON defeats three consecutive opponents earlier this same night, earning him entry into Seven Deadly Sins.

Whether he does or doesn't, the Seven Deadly Sins match is sure to be an absolutely electric affair. This elite group of world-class athletes will lay it all on the line for the right to call themselves the very last PWA World Heavyweight Champion. The only question is: which one of these warriors wants it bad enough to endure Seven Deadly Sins?

It was back in 2003 that VULTURE and GREG TANTALUS, already two of the most hated competitors in the PWA, decided to join forces with one simple philosophy in mind: Strength In Numbers. And after the formation of SIN, the two ran roughshod over the PWA for nine months, until their egos could no longer co-exist and the group became fractured. After taking time away from the business to undergo neck surgery, Vulture returned to the sudden cheers of the PWA fans, as Tantalus had taken his villainy to even greater heights in his absence. As Vulture and Tantalus moved closer and closer to war, the situation was complicated by Vulture's romantic relationship with Tantalus' sister Lauren. Finally, with Vulture's recovery from neck surgery tenuous at best, the decision was made for Vulture to retire after *Everlasting Epic III*. His final opponent: Greg Tantalus.

However, on that warm Summer night in 2004, the unthinkable happened: with Vulture on the verge of victory, Lauren betrayed him, smacking him with a steel chair and letting the world know that, in this war, her support was with her brother. Greg Tantalus defeated Vulture on that night, ruining what was to be his ride into the crimson sunset.

Fast forward six years, and the landscape has changed greatly. Vulture has come out of retirement, but his career has stalled, unable to reclaim his place in the main event. Greg Tantalus, on the other hand, has had to endure obstacle after obstacle due to a personal vendetta with PWA creative director Justin Schenck. For now, the fans actually support both men, but that is about to change.

May 21, 2011. *Symphony of Destruction*. Vulture and Greg Tantalus shock the world by putting their past behind them and reforming the group known as SIN. For Tantalus, this was a way of empowering himself against the perceived tyranny of the PWA's leader. For Vulture, it was a shortcut back to the top of the mountain. And the shortcut worked. Despite his obvious guilt and mixed emotions, it landed Vulture a shot at the PWA Championship and Jason Calysto in the main event of *Everlasting Epic VII*. But Vulture lost. And that's when everything changed.

Vulture returned to the locker room, only to be met by Tantalus and heated accusations of letting SIN down. Then, once the adrenaline wore off, Vulture's body failed him, going into shock, necessitating a trip to the emergency room. After seriously contemplating retirement the entire offseason, Vulture returned to the ring for *The Rebirth's* third season, mostly to protect his wife Morgan Day, his children The Duval Twins, and his future son-in-law John Wolfe – all SIN members

– from Tantalus’ wrath. What resulted was a long, heartbreaking string of failures, embarrassment, and emasculation for the three-time PWA World Heavyweight Champion that forced him to seriously reconsider his decision. The final straw was the 2012 *Symphony of Destruction*, the one-year anniversary of SIN’s reformation, when winning one match could have rid the PWA of Schenck, the man who had long been Tantalus’ tormentor. But Vulture lost. Again. Just as he had in every single match the entire season. Just as he did at *EE7*. And this time, Tantalus wasn’t letting it go.

Always skirting the edge of sanity, Tantalus had been slowly drifting further into the deep end throughout the entire SIN revival. After the *SOD* defeat, Tantalus went full-on unhinged. During the break, Tantalus and Vulture came to an agreement that Vulture would announce his retirement, in exchange for Tantalus and SIN leaving Vulture’s family alone. However, when Vulture came out to the ring to make the announcement, Tantalus interrupted his speech, informed Vulture that he lied, and kicked him below the belt. Once again, Tantalus had ruined Vulture’s swan song.

But he wasn’t done. The next week, Tantalus made good on his word, organizing a systematic assault on everyone close to Vulture. His sister Lauren returned to the PWA to take out Vulture’s wife Morgan. Vulture’s cousins James Biamonte and Dee Licious were turned against him and took their aggression out on his children. And Tantalus brought Jackie Baccaro back to the PWA – a man Vulture trained and came out of retirement to defeat, a man that trained Vulture’s own children, that dated his daughter, and whose neck was broken by Vulture’s son. The new SIN had been formed, and Vulture’s family was decimated. And the next week, Tantalus took his new teammates to Vulture’s home in Long Beach, N.Y., to finish the job. When they got there, though, they weren’t met by a beaten group of individuals. They were met by five fearless warriors who were prepared to defend their turf. Now dubbing themselves The Absolved, Vulture and his family took the fight to SIN, with Vulture even attempting to drown Tantalus in the Atlantic Ocean before the melee was broken up by police.

At this point, Vulture had no choice but to return to the ring for one final battle. Just as he did at *Everlasting Epic III*, Vulture will head to the ring on October 20th for his last match, and his opponent will be Greg Tantalus. But this time, the match will be contested in the brutal structure known simply as Hell in a Cell. A 20-foot steel cell will encase the ring, with no doors and no escape. There are no count-outs, there are no disqualifications. The match continues until one man is pinned or submitted. And for a man like Vulture, whose 46-year-old body is breaking down, simply surviving Hell in a Cell is no guarantee. Especially not with an opponent as sadistic as Greg Tantalus. That’s why the PWA forced both men to sign hold-harmless agreements just to have this match. And, much to Morgan Day’s chagrin, Vulture signed it.

There is no doubt that Hell in a Cell will be Vulture’s final match. The only question is the state he will be in when he exits the cell. Will he finally conquer Greg Tantalus after two ruined retirements and walk away on his own terms? Or will he be helped out of the cell on a stretcher? Hell in a Cell will mark the end of a magnificent career. But it’s not just his career on the line. It’s not just his long-term health. Vulture is also putting his very life on the line. And all indications are that, no matter what happens, Tantalus will be remorseless.

THE LOST SOULS had always been fueled by the darkness. It's what gave them the edge they needed to win the PWA Tag Team Championship on three separate occasions. The high-flying abilities of SPEED DEMON coupled with the raw power of REAPER made them a formidable team, but what separated them from the pack was the fact that they thrived on chaos, and could reach down within themselves to depths that others simply couldn't. In fact, shortly before heading to the ring, Demon would often taunt their opponents by exclaiming, "Welcome to darkness. Enjoy."

It was a fate their opponents rarely enjoyed, but The Lost Souls were indeed at home in that darkness. So much so that when the manipulative anarchist BISHOP CROSS was recruiting members for his Army of the Damned, the Souls were immediate and natural targets.

But after their negative experience as members of SIN two years earlier, Speed Demon and Reaper were in no mood to do someone else's dirty work. Cross, however, refused to take no for an answer. And luckily for him, Demon and Reaper were drifting apart. Thanks to a budding relationship with a woman named Dana, Demon was growing tired of being a Lost Soul, and in desperate search of a purpose. Reaper, meanwhile, was comfortable in his role and had no desire to change it.

Cross got to Reaper and turned him against Demon, resulting in a violent assault that Dana got caught up in. It caused Demon to lose her forever, and left him with a hideous scar over his right eye that would be with him for as long as Dana would not.

With Reaper serving as Cross' most loyal soldier, the Army of the Damned was impenetrable. But that didn't stop Speed Demon. After several months away planning his revenge, Demon began

picking off Cross' soldiers one by one, even breaking the neck of his former partner Reaper along the way. Finally, at *Everlasting Epic V*, Bishop Cross was all that remained, and Demon defeated him in an insane Buried Alive match that resulted in Cross being locked inside a casket, with mountains of dirt forklifted on top of it. The end of this war coincided with the end of PWA. And for years, this truly was the end.

Nearly four years later, Speed Demon emerged for *The Rebirth* and immediately pronounced himself dead, having been reborn as DAN CROWLEY. Leaving Cross, Reaper, and the Army of the Damned entrenched in his past, Crowley marched forward and, at *Everlasting Epic VI*, he reached the pinnacle of his career, winning the PWA World Heavyweight Championship. With no reason to exist in the darkness, Crowley now thrived in the light.

Nine months later, however, on the very night Crowley would lose the championship, Reaper re-emerged, touting a similar rebirth. Now known as RICH REVIS, he renounced his decision to join the Army of the Damned, and proclaimed himself his own man. Over time, Crowley and Revis – once the best of friends – found a way to forgive each other for their atrocities and move forward. It was a great ending for two great warriors. Until the 2012 *Symphony of Destruction*.

On that night, as Crowley stood in the ring, awaiting his opponent, Bishop Cross made a shocking return to the spotlight after six years in hiding. As Crowley came face-to-face with his greatest rival and most hated enemy, he was blindsided by MARKUS KRIEG, an underachieving German giant whose career Crowley had derailed just a few months earlier. Now firmly entrenched as Cross' newest minion, Krieg was unstoppable, with Cross finally providing him the guidance to unleash his inner monster.

To add insult to injury, Cross and Krieg dubbed themselves THE SOUL STEALERS, taunting Crowley and Revis for losing the darkness that drove them both to incredible heights. When Crowley and Revis joined forces to take The Soul Stealers down, Cross was proven right, as they were met with a swift and resounding defeat. And with their adversaries out of the way, Cross and Krieg immediately upended Paul Dawkins & Renegade to become PWA Tag Team Champions.

But now, at *Everlasting Epic VIII*, Crowley and Revis will return to take one last shot at The Soul Stealers, this time in a match where count-outs and disqualifications count for nothing, and no holds are barred. And if what Crowley and Revis hinted at 11 nights before *EE8* is to be believed, the two will be on a mission to dig up what they've buried. They will try to, for one night, tap into the long-lost darkness and give rise to Speed Demon and Reaper.

Will Dan Crowley and Rich Revis be able to resurrect The Lost Souls? And even if they do, will it be enough to stop The Soul Stealers' reign of terror?

When LAUREN TANTALUS betrayed then-boyfriend Vulture at *Everlasting Epic III* and sided with her brother Greg, she gave up her status as most popular woman on the PWA roster, immediately becoming its most hated. However, just three months later, Lauren suffered a massive concussion that kept her away from the ring for the better part of six years. In that interim, MORGAN DAY emerged in the PWA and – with her charisma, wit, and general bad-assery – quickly claimed Lauren’s old position of most popular female competitor. And just four months after the English spitfire made her debut, Morgan toppled the unbeaten champion Keiko Ishida, who rose to prominence in the aftermath of Lauren’s fall. She reigned supreme until the end of PWA’s initial run, after which she married the man who trained her: Vulture. However, during the near-four-year break, Morgan fully embraced family life. She and Vulture settled down and had a child together, and Morgan Day was fully content being a wife and a mother. That is until *The Rebirth* came calling. Mostly out of worry for her husband’s safety, Morgan returned to the PWA to defend the Women’s Championship she retired with. But it was clear Morgan wasn’t fully focused, as she was upended by newcomer Zina just a few weeks after *The Rebirth* began. Meanwhile, Lauren Tantalus had returned to the PWA, starting what she hoped would be a triumphant comeback. The two women mostly kept their distance from each other – until the 2011 *Symphony of Destruction*, when they competed in a triple threat elimination match for the Women’s title. Just after Morgan finally pinned Zina to end her reign, Lauren blindsided Morgan to claim her fourth championship. However, when the three rematched just a few weeks later, Morgan dropped Lauren on her head with the Daybreak – her signature maneuver – putting Lauren out of action with another serious concussion. Many assumed we would never see Lauren again – until she made her shocking return some 13 months later in a violent assault on Morgan to mark her reunion with her brother in SIN. Since then, Lauren has accused Morgan of wasting the opportunities she’s been afforded in the Rebirth Era, and letting her family life negatively impact her career. And, as if the mental torment wasn’t enough, Lauren added physical pain to the equation, cracking a dressing room lamp over Morgan’s skull just 11 days before *EE8*, forcing Morgan to endure the same concussion issues from which Lauren has suffered for years. Morgan will be stepping into the ring at Citi Field against doctor’s orders, but she will be doing so to prove to Lauren, the world, and herself that she is still the same Morgan Day.

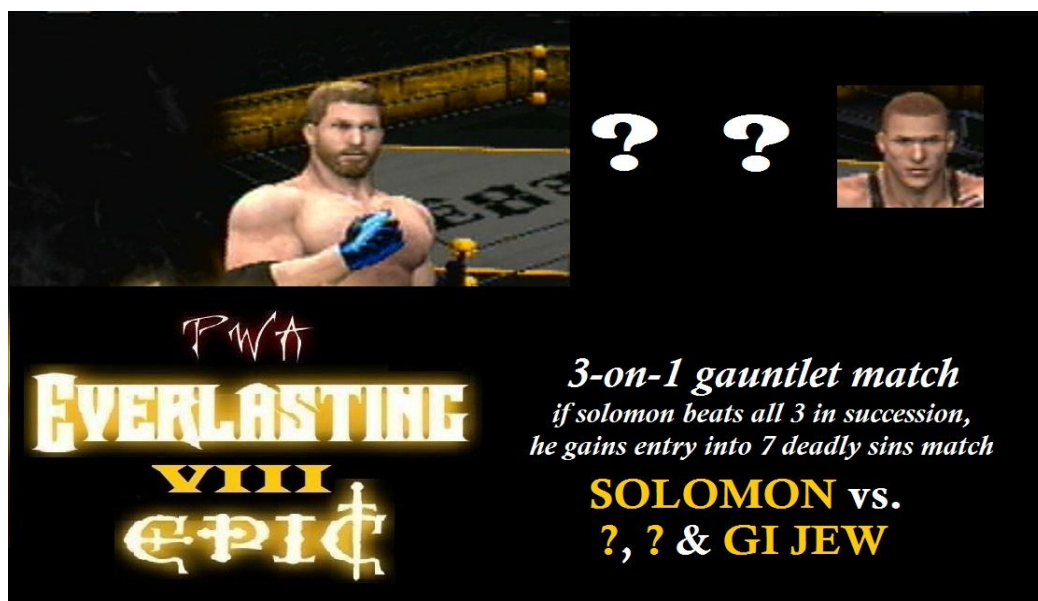
The effects of the war between Vulture and Greg Tantalus were passed down a generation to Vulture's children. Members of THE ABSOLVED – Vulture's son CHRIS DUVAL and future son-in-law JOHN WOLFE – will go to war with members of SIN – Vulture's former protégé JACKIE BACCARO and Vulture's cousin JAMES BIAMONTE – in a match that's as much about The Absolved vs. SIN as it is about Vulture's family against his enemies. But the most vital cog in this match is ALEXIS DUVAL – daughter of Vulture, twin sister of Chris, and fiancé of Wolfe. Before she was betrothed to Wolfe, Alexis was the paramour of Baccaro – at the time, her father's worst enemy. The Duval Twins were estranged from Vulture at that time, as he had only recently been made aware of their existence.

But Baccaro poisoned that relationship from the get-go, mentoring Chris Duval the way Vulture mentored him, and preying on the vulnerable young mind of Alexis. Over time, it became clear that Baccaro was abusing Alexis verbally – and one day, a loud backhanded slap from Baccaro moved that abuse into the physical realm. Then, Vulture and Greg Tantalus chose to reform SIN. But the one major hurdle was eliminating Baccaro, who had been Tantalus' ally. Using the Alexis situation as fuel, Vulture salvaged a relationship with Chris and forged one with Alexis' obvious suitor Wolfe. Together, they set up a trap for Baccaro that ended with Chris breaking the neck of his mentor. That night, SIN was officially re-formed and all became members. But when Vulture and his family broke off into The Absolved some 15 months later, Tantalus made peace with Baccaro and brought him back. And this isn't the same Jackie Baccaro. This is a betrayed, violence-ridden beast, an impossibly strong man who now refers to himself as the "Hammer of God." And he's partnered with the cunning and devious James Biamonte, a man known as the PWA's resident jackal. And in their corner they have DEE LICIOUS, a wily veteran who has led many a man to victory. It will be youth and passion vs. experience and malice when The Absolved and SIN tangle at *Everlasting Epic VIII*. And with Alexis and Dee ringside, a tremendously combustible situation could be in the works.

For almost the entire first half of *The Rebirth's* third season, the Alaskan Monster SOLOMON reigned supreme as PWA Champion. Every competitor that was put before him, Solomon overcame, to the chagrin of the PWA crowd. Until the 2012 *Symphony of Destruction*, that is. In a controversial move, PWA creative director Justin

Schenck forced Solomon to defend the championship in the 30-man Symphony of Destruction match, drastically diminishing his odds of retaining the gold. Solomon made it to the final three, however, before being eliminated by archrival Evan Black, who went on to win the title. When *The Rebirth* returned from its midseason break, Solomon demanded a one-on-one rematch, despite the fact that the two were prohibited from competing one-on-one, thanks to a condition of Solomon's victory over Black at *Everlasting Epic VII* – a clause he used to avoid Black his entire title reign. However, Schenck came up with a compromise: if both parties agreed to waive this clause, they would compete for the PWA title in a match that would double as a Seven Deadly Sins qualifier. Both agreed, and this time, Black won. Solomon would not be a part of the SDS.

Or so we thought.

In the weeks that followed, the 7'0" 330-pound giant threw the world's largest temper tantrum, essentially holding the PWA hostage. He claimed that if he were not allowed to compete for the world championship in Seven Deadly Sins, he would refuse to perform at *Everlasting Epic VIII* in any capacity. Solomon even took the step of no-showing episodes of *The Rebirth* until he got what he wanted. Fearing a drop in pay-per-view buys

should the mercurial monster fail to compete at *EE8*, Schenck again found what he believed to be a good compromise: Solomon would compete at *EE8* against three opponents, the last of which would be his longtime enemy GI JEW. The first two would be chosen at Schenck's discretion and announced as they were walking to the ring at Citi Field. Should Solomon defeat all three opponents in succession, he would be added to the Seven Deadly Sins match as its first-ever ninth participant. If that were to come to pass, when the match reached the Sixth Sin – inside the steel cage – there would be two men eliminated instead of one. Solomon agreed to the bout, and Schenck believed he had averted disaster. However, he soon realized that GI Jew was

less than thrilled about being a pawn in his plan. Schenck refused to grant GI Jew – who had lost a SDS qualifier to Chase Stone – access to the *EE8* main event if he defeated Solomon, telling him instead that he'd "owe him one" if he accomplished that mission. With the identities of Solomon's first two opponents still a mystery, and GI Jew's willingness to be a good soldier for Justin Schenck also in question, anything can happen in this explosive three-on-one gauntlet match.

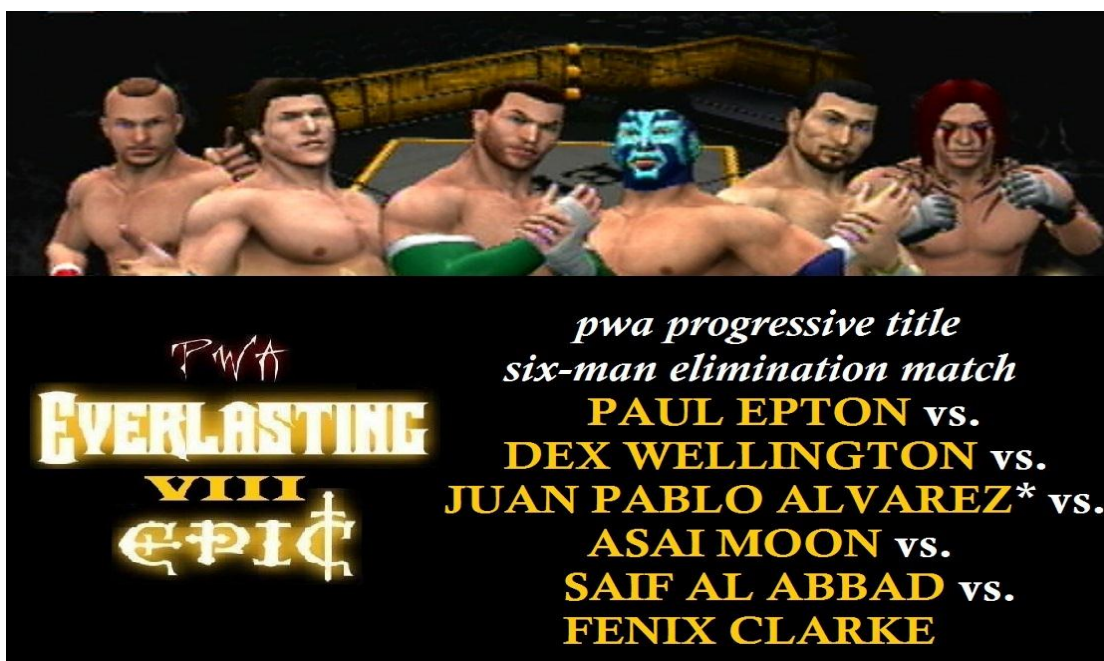


The prestigious International Championship of the PWA will be contested in a six-man elimination match at *Everlasting Epic VIII*, providing a serious test for new champion MATTHEW MAGELLAN, who won the championship less than one month ago. JON DULBERG, the man he defeated for that title, seeks to regain it at Citi Field while delegitimizing the champion, whom Dulberg believes to be nothing more than comic relief. Magellan, who is known for delighting crowds with his exaggerated hip swivels and pelting foes with pies, will also need to concern himself with MICHAEL GRIECO, a man he and manager/girlfriend Jade tortured last year. Perhaps on the verge of a breakout, Grieco and his own manager/girlfriend Dee Licious got sucked into a feud with Magellan and Jade that resulted in constant embarrassment and faces full of pie – all to the joy of the PWA fans. Like Dulberg, Grieco is bent on embarrassing Magellan and making his reign a short one. However, one man in this match who isn't anti-Magellan is PWA Hall of Famer and Hardcore Icon KERRY COX, who earned entry into this match by defeating Magellan's former bodyguard Briggs, a man who turned on Magellan to perform the same function for Dulberg, who himself was Cox's former protégé. With his spot in this match secure, Cox – who will become one of just seven men to compete at all eight installments of *Everlasting Epic* – will look to gain revenge on Dulberg and tie both Dulberg and Grieco for the most International title reigns in history at three. But no one should overlook two newly-minted singles wrestlers in this match: the former members of Texas Justice, MADDOX TATE and PITBULL. Though neither man has much experience in singles competition, they are accustomed to the carnage this type of match can bring. Once they've finished beating the hell out of each other, they could spread that carnage to the rest of the field.

Just like the International title, the PWA Progressive Championship will be on the line at *Everlasting Epic VIII* in a six-man elimination bout. But unlike that match – which features a slew of sinewy street-fighters – this contest will highlight the PWA’s cruiserweight division, comprised mostly of energetic daredevils. The action promises to be fast-paced and high-flying, especially if young ASAI MOON has his way. The popular 22-year-old Japanese Sensation has been slowly rising in the cruiserweight ranks, but if the masked marvel hopes to become Progressive Champion, he will need to put it all together on October 20th. He will have competition from his friend and occasional tag team partner SAIF AL ABBAD, the most recent former champion. Saif lost the title in September after being injured in the middle of a title defense, and has not competed since. Questions abound as to whether Saif will be 100% at *EE8*, but the altruistic Arab will certainly give it his all – and he’ll no doubt have the fans in his corner as he attempts to climb back to the top of the cruiserweight mountain. But they’ll both have to contend with the reigning Progressive Champion JUAN PABLO ALVAREZ, a man who is as angry and jealous as he is fit and gifted. Alvarez resents Moon for unmasking him some 18 months ago, bringing Alvarez great dishonor in his native Mexico. And he resents Saif for getting all the accolades from the PWA fans with what he believes is an inferior resume. While Alvarez may have a point, audiences dislike him because of his incessant whining – and his loose affiliation with the hated Connecticut-bred old-money millionaire DEXTER P. WELLINGTON doesn’t help. A four-time Progressive Champion in his own right, the morally bankrupt Wellington will try to overcome three straight *Everlasting Epic* losses to emerge the final titleholder. As will PAUL EPTON, the Rebirth Era’s first Progressive Champion, and a man who has been lost in a bizarre love triangle with FENIX CLARKE for much of the past two years. Their joint dealings with Emily Walker turned the fans against Epton and placed them decidedly in Clarke’s corner, but with Emily now gone from PWA, Epton and Clarke will be left to focus on regaining the Progressive title – but is this renewed focus too little, too late?

And on that day – Pearl Harbor Day, coincidentally – KEIKO ISHIDA invaded the PWA from Japan and conquered the division, capturing the Women's Championship. For an astounding 389 days, Keiko reigned supreme, until she was finally defeated on New Year's Eve 2005 by Morgan Day. Keiko and Morgan spent the rest of the PWA's first run trading the title back and forth, with Morgan proving the ultimate victor. But when the PWA resumed for *The Rebirth*, Morgan found herself quickly upended by the division's new force of nature: ZINA. Throughout the Rebirth Era, Zina has proven herself to be the new queen of the mountain, dominating the division to the same extent that Keiko dominated years ago. But now, at *Everlasting Epic VIII*, the irresistible force will finally meet the immovable object. Going one-on-one for the first time ever on pay-per-view, the two most dominant forces in the history of the PWA women's division will battle for supremacy. The Tokyo Terror vs. The Moscow Mauler. The Oshimai running STO vs. The Siberian Express bicycle kick. The Gyaku Gorichin foot guillotine vs. The Russian Bearhug. Who will reign supreme when Zina defends the Women's Championship against Keiko Ishida? We'll find out October 20th at Citi Field.



When PWA Hall of Famer HOLLYWOOD MIKE GRIFFIN joined forces with former PWA World Heavyweight Champion THE MIRACLE MIKE TROHA and his slimeball manager the "Standard Sleaze" DON CERRONE to form THE HOLLYWOOD MIRACLE, they expected to quickly rise to the top of the tag team ladder. And they did just that, winning the Tag Team Championship just two months later. However, what they didn't expect was to be upset for those titles by PAUL DAWKINS & RENEGADE, a set of popular and underrated former champions. At *Everlasting Epic VIII*, The Hollywood Miracle will have another shot at Dawkins & Renegade, seeking to prove their defeat in early September a fluke. But this time, to offset the ringside presence of Cerrone, Dawkins & Renegade will have KEMI OKORO in their corner, a woman who has a score to settle with the scummy Standard Sleaze, who has been needlessly treating her poorly for weeks.
